Christian Education Foundational Principles

• Purpose Of Education:

- i) To instill in each child an awareness of God's presence in his or her life.
- ii) To provide the child with an understanding of self as he or she relates to God, to others, and to the world around him or her so as to serve the Lord faithfully in all areas.
- iii) To provide learning experiences suitable to the needs and abilities of each child.
- iv) To promote the development of each child to his or her full potential.
- **Parents:** God has given parents the responsibility to nurture and educate their children. In order to fulfill part of their educational task, Christian schools should be established.

Staff

- Drayton Christian School staff members are personally committed to the vision and mission of the school.
- All staff must declare their unconditional agreement with the Constitution (Drayton Christian School Society), must be scripturally sound in their teaching, and must lead exemplary lives.
- The staff is comprised of individuals who profess Jesus Christ as Lord of their life. They must commit to upholding the 17 characteristics distinctive of Christian school staff as outlined in the Society bylaws. These characteristics are to be goals for daily practice.
 - i) An example of Godliness, personal holiness, and Christ-centered actions.
 - ii) Manifests a sense of call to Christian School teaching ministry, not only of occupation.
 - iii) Articulates well a Christian philosophy of education.
 - iv) Applies a Christian philosophy in instructional content and methods.
 - v) Develops a classroom environment that evidences Christian principles through displays, mottos, and interpersonal relationships.
 - vi) Integrates subject matter with Biblical Truth.
 - vii) Communicates with students how the Bible and Jesus Christ relate to all life.
 - viii) Makes prayer a vital experience in his/her own life, for students and the ministry of the School.
 - ix) Attracts students to Christ, is capable of leading students to personal trust in Christ, and uses every opportunity available to bring students into a close relationship with Christ.
 - x) Stimulates students to a genuine worship of God.
 - xi) Is an enthusiastic student of the Bible and the tools of Bible study.

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- xii) Teaches the inerrant truth of Scripture.
- xiii) Is sensitive to the spiritual needs and Work of God in individual students.
- xiv) Views school faculty as a spiritual body for mutual fellowship.
- xv) Is committed to the principles of Matthew 18:15-17 to maintain wholesome relationships.
- xvi) Commits themselves and fulfills a personal responsibility to their local church.
- xvii) Eager to become a better teacher by willingly receiving reproof and constructive suggestions.

Curriculum:

- Drayton Christian School provides a curriculum which satisfies the requirements of the Alberta Education Program of Studies taught from a Christian perspective.
- In order to meet the Christian perspective outcomes and to assist our staff in their task, we utilize the resources of the Prairie Centre for Christian Education.
- DCS will provide a program based on the following convictions:
 - i) God is Creator of the world and every living thing.
 - ii) Faith directed learning leads to purposeful living.
 - iii) Curriculum guidelines must affirm the diversity, complexity, and richness of God's world.
 - iv) The curriculum will follow the Alberta Education Program of Studies.
 - v) Biblical principles are relevant to all areas of study.
 - vi) DCS will offer a program that equips students with relevant skills and the discernment required to practice a Christian life.
 - vii) DCS will offer a program that acknowledges the unique and individual needs of students.
 - viii) DCS will offer a program that addresses real-life problems and encourages students to generate real solutions.
 - ix) Teachers will provide the Principal with Christian thematic statements for all unit plans.
 - x) DCS will make regular program reviews and revisions as necessary.
 - xi) DCS will require teachers to regularly attend program development and curriculum planning workshops according to the collective agreement. As well as Christian teachers convention and administrative/leadership development.
 - xii) The Principal will lead teachers in the on-going development of the program and supervise curriculum, with the involvement of the DCS Council and Society.
 - xiii) The Principal will demonstrate that the school's vision and mission are evident in curriculum and pedagogy.
